Call for Paper

The 7th international symposium 2018 organized by the Graduate School of Advanced Integrated Studies in human survivability (GSAIS) at Kyoto university will take place in symposium hall, international science innovation building at Kyoto university, on 10th December 2018. The theme of 7th international symposium 2018 is "Let's work together toward achieving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)". The 7th international symposium 2018 now invites authors to submit an abstract paper for presentation at the symposium. The submitted abstracts will be reviewed by the scientific program committee of the symposium. Accepted authors will have an opportunity to present their individual contributions at the symposium. The authors are eligible to submit their papers after presenting their contributions in the symposium and the papers will be published in a prominent academic journal after passing a required review process. There are two types of presentations: oral and poster.

1. Oral Presentation

Organization committee of the 7th international symposium 2018 is currently open for submission of oral presentation. Presenters are expected to talk about 20 minutes for the symposium participants.

2. Poster Presentation

Accepted authors will make a poster based on the adopted paper and bring it to the symposium. The posters will be displayed in the venue. The program will allocate time for authors to present their posters and interact directly with the participants.

3. Scope

Submitted abstract papers have to satisfy one of the following thematic scopes of the symposium:

- (1) Original study focused on each of SDGs. Trans-disciplinary studies are highly desired.
- (2) Current state monitoring of SDGs. Do we have make measurable progress on achieving SDGs? Ouantitative evaluations are recommended.
- (3) Synergy and trade-off between SDGs. Some of the goals can be achieved simultaneously, while others require compromise or higher level solutions. Both quantitative and qualitative studies are included in the scope.
- (4) Science communication for effective implementation of research results in society. How should we share knowledge with citizen? How should we bridge research results on SDGs to policy-makers?

4. Submission

Abstract format: Abstract paper have to be written in English according to the template available on the GSAIS web site (http://www.gsais.kyoto-u.ac.jp/blog/2018/10/12/20181029). The length has to be within 2 pages at a maximum. The abstract must include Author's name(s), affiliation(s), email address, paper title, and a figure to show the main result of the paper.

Deadline: Oct. 29, 2018 (no later than 17:00 Japan Standard Time)

Selection: The scientific program committee will review the abstract papers and choose the eligible candidates for oral/poster presentations at the symposium.

Notification: Notifications of acceptance will be sent out to all applicants by e-mail on Nov. 12, 2018. Registration: Accepted author has to register the symposium.
